THENGAL MANOR



Thengal Manor, a grand mansion constructed in 1928 holds a significant place in history. It served as the launch site for the Assam's first daily newspaper - 'Dainik Batori', in 1935. Originally the residence of Shiva Prasad Barooah, a prominent Assamese tea planter and philanthropist, this majestic estate has been well restored, showcasing its opulent architecture and vintage interiors adorned with priceless antiques.








The mansion offers four deluxe rooms and one single superior room, all featuring colonial-style architecture, furnishings, and décor. Guests can immerse themselves in luxury in a quaint village setting soaking in its rich history and elegance. Thengal Manor, a century-old bungalow is a fine example of participatory preservation of India's colonial architectural heritage.

Nestled amidst the village of Jalukonibari, Thengal Manor invites guests to experience luxury living in the plush suites comprising single and double bedrooms and attached baths and dressing rooms. They are complemented by a living room, a dining room, a lounge, kitchen and pantry.
