## HERITAGE CITY, JORHAT

Jorhat's quest for historical heritage has two facets. Of significant interest is the fact that Jorhat was the capital of the Ahom kings in the late 18th Century before falling to the Burmese invasion. And after the arrival of the British who ruled India, colonial architecture made its mark. Today, a combination of these two elements has created a network of heritage structures that can be enjoyed by a simple walk along the small city.

Among the leading attractions of heritage value include:

- DC's Office, the administrative office of Jorhat
- Chameli Memsab Bungalow, Burra Sahib's Bungalow
- Doss & Co, the oldest departmental store in north east India
- Ahom-era tanks Kunwori Phukri, Baduli Phukri, Bangal Phukri and Raimao Pukhuri
- Guest House at Tocklai Tea Research Centre
- Raja Maidam, the burial ground of erstwhile King Purandar Sinha
- Thengal Bhavan, from where Assam's first newspaper was published
- Jorhat Gymkhana Club, Asia's oldest golf club
